#### **UK TECHNICAL SPECIALIST NETWORK (TSN) CONFERENCE**

The inaugural UK Technical Specialist Network conference was held 18th to 19th April 2023 at the University of Edinburgh.

Building on the pillars of the Technician Commitment, a UK initative that aims to

increase visibility, recognition, career development and sustainability of technicians, a new UK network - the Technical Specialist Network (TSN) has been

set up for technical specialists. TSN has been founded by nine individuals from higher education and research institutes to develop a national group that will enhance skills and knowledge of individuals and strengthen institutional expertise. Funding from TALENT (a project led by the Midlands Innovation consortium of 8 universities) has enabled the



establishment of this network. The network has been formed to share best practice, understand the funding landscape, share industry insights and of course to encourage networking amongst a group of staff that can often feel isolated.

We came together for the first time at the inaugural UK Technology Specialists Network (TSN) conference hosted by University of Edinburgh on 18th and 19th April 2023. The conference was opened by college registrar Anne-Marie Coriat and Scott Davidson, Deputy Director of Social Responsibility and Sustainability, discussing the importance of technical innovation in environmental sustainability. The first session was on Open Research, which University of Edinburgh place a strong emphasis on, highlighting the role that facilities play in high quality methods, data management and data integrity. The afternoon sessions featured speakers discussing finance models of core facilities opened by Danielle Hoyle, Babraham Institute and a panel discussion, which included Joanne Marrison from University of York, Ian Brewis form Cardiff University, Tony Chapman from EPSRC and Nik Ogryzko from UKRI. Important updates on funding were given from UK government funding bodies (UKRI and ESPRC) highlighting the change in opportunity for technical specialists leading facilities, now able to apply as Co-I or lead equipment bids. Day 1 ended with short talks from a range of technical specialists from scientific and creative specialisms. The networking continued, with an evening meal at the Playfair Library Hall.

The second day was opened by Dr Kelly Vere, lead of the MI Talent project, giving important sector updates, followed by a focus on sustainability of technical skills through Foundation Apprentice schemes in Scotland, with David Dickson from East Lothian Schools and Graham Allen and Annabel Stewart from Charles River Laboratories, while Modern Apprenticeships were discussed by University of Southampton from Gareth Savage. Anneke Lubben, Director of Research Infrastructures at University of Bath gave great insight into infrastructure grant applications and her career development to date, followed by a closing sessions on personal experiences of applying for equipment bids from Tony Larson, David Walker, Alex Laude and Matthieu Vermeren.

TSN conference event sponsors were Stratocore, SCIEX, INTEGRA, Peak Scientific, Nikon and SpectralWorks. Sponsorship and funding from TALENT and the University of Edinburgh enabled setting up of travel bursaries, which were awarded to 30 individuals.

Feedback from the network during and after the event was incredibly positive and there is a real appetite for the network to continue. To share best practice for technical specialists across the UK, and in particular to meet others in similar roles, while learning to navigate the funding opportunities and challenges in the UK setting. Our network is keen to welcome new members to the network, from all levels and disciplines across the UK.

FIRST NATIONAL CONGRESS OF ITALIAN CORE FACILITIES NETWORK (NICO)

The First National Congress of Italian Core Facilities Network (NICO) was held in March with CTLS endorsement. This first meeting, organised by University of Milan in the historical location of Ca' Granda, provided the opportunity to get to know the different realities that actively participate in the innovation challenges in Italy, to encourage system initiatives, and to build critical mass.

The outcomes we expect from this kind of initiatives are increasing the number of scientific and technological synergies, common management practices, and participation in research projects and funding initiatives.

The audience, researchers, facilities staff, administrators, companies, and policymakers had the chance to learn about the importance of the Italian Core Facilities for the national and international research in life sciences and to listen to the CTLS achievements and efforts in an exciting talk by one of our CTLS Board of Directors, Lola Martinez.

Many other CTLS members have been presenting and attending, including the CTLS BoD member Valentina Adami who introduced, with CTLS member Gabriella Tedeschi, the newly created Italian Network NICO to the audience, and Training group vice-chairs Viktoryia Sidarovich and Veronica De Sanctis, the last one participating in a round Table on "Career development and professional updating of the Core Facility Technical Manager."


